CARES ACT

- PCC Notified It Will Receive More than \$5.5 million in Federal Relief Aid through the Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security (CARES) Act Signed into Law March 27
- At Least 50 Percent Must be Spent on Student Aid
- Notified Eligible Students and Received More Than 2,000 Applications; Already Awarded More than \$1 million in Emergency Student Aid
- Administrators Making Plans for Allocating Remaining CARES Act Funding (Improved technology for online course delivery is a focus.)



MOVING FORWARD...

- Virtual Graduation PCC's Class of 2020 (1,196 grads who earned a combined 1,847 degrees, diplomas and certificates) will be honored during a ceremony that goes live online June 1 and will remain active for viewing for one year
- Registration Course signup for summer and fall has taken place strictly online; Payment, new student orientation and academic advising have also been online
- Summer Courses Classes being offered via the internet (and some in-person)
- "Trade Your Job for a Career" Encouraging underemployed and those seeking a change in employment to consider PCC enrollment
- Contingency Plans for fall include some in-person and hybrid courses
- Athletics Unsure about upcoming seasons, particularly volleyball, but our coaches are recruiting and signing players per NJCAA rules and determining how to manage rosters due to extended eligibility for spring sports
