*This schedule is tentative, contingent upon the guidelines set forth by the NC Governor by the date of the first scheduled ceremony, and is subject to change. Should this plan go forward, the following guidelines will apply: Strict social distancing will be practiced and enforced. Face masks are required to be worn by all graduates and guests. Face masks will be provided for graduates and staff members only. Guests must provide their own face covering. Each graduate will be provided TWO guest tickets. Graduates may only attend ONE ceremony. There are no exceptions to the guidelines. All ceremonies will be live-streamed and available for download. Changes to this schedule will be announced no later than May 28, 2020. Rain delays will be announced as soon as is feasible.

PCS Graduation 2020 Frequently Asked Questions:

Who decided on this format for graduation? From collaboration, conversation, and surveys, the senior class of 2020, their parents, staff members, and the Pitt County Board of Education, have overwhelmingly indicated that an in-person graduation with an opportunity for each graduate to walk across the stage and hear his/her name called was the priority. The proposed tentative plan is our best attempt to accommodate the wishes of the Senior Class of 2020 and other key stakeholders.

Why are ceremonies held outside this year, and what if there's bad weather? In light of what experts have shared about COVID-19, outdoor venues afford greater space to practice social distancing and are preferred to indoor spaces where there is a higher risk of transmission. Ceremonies have been tentatively scheduled early in the morning to avoid excessive heat and possible afternoon thunderstorms that are typical in our area during the month of June. Tentative rain dates and live stream options are also provided.

Why have two graduation ceremonies been tentatively scheduled for some schools? PCS high schools vary in size. In order to distance our graduates and guests in line with expert guidance (North Carolina Division of Health and Human Services Wear, Wait, Wash Protocol), our three largest high schools will need to host a minimum of two graduation ceremonies instead of one. Division of students will be made and communicated at the school level. Students may only attend one graduation ceremony- no exceptions, including student speakers.

Why does the current plan only allow for two guests per graduate? While we understand that graduates have more than two family members and important personal guests, we do not have sufficient space to practice social distancing at our schools if more than two guests attend. As a result, a strict limit on the guest list was necessary. All additional guests can access the ceremony online through our live stream.

Is my graduate required to attend, and is it safe? There is no attendance requirement for seniors. Safety can never be 100% guaranteed for anyone. We will follow the latest NCDHHS guidelines (*Wear, Wait, Wash* Protocol) and practice social distancing as well as sanitize frequently. We urge all potential attendees to make their own personal health decisions regarding attendance and to consider others. Please do not attend if you have been recently exposed to a COVID-19 positive person or you display any symptoms associated with COVID-19 such as fever, cough, shortness of breath, etc.

What if I don't believe in wearing a facemask? In line with current NCDHHS (Wear, Wait, Wash Protocol) recommendations, to attend graduation under this tentative plan, students, staff, and guests are required to wear face masks upon exiting their vehicles to attend the graduation and continue to wear these masks through the graduation until they return to their vehicles to depart. Students or staff are not required to remove their masks but will be afforded a brief exception to take an official photograph and/or to speak in an official capacity on stage. Live stream options are available.

What will the actual graduation ceremony look like? In line with the wishes of the Class of 2020, we wish to preserve as many details of what we traditionally value in a graduation ceremony, with some limitations. For example, Junior Marshals will be recognized in a school's program but will not be in attendance. *Pomp and Circumstance* and other music will be played via recording instead of a live orchestra or band. No color guard will precede the National Anthem. Board members and dignitaries will not necessarily be seated on stage. We will do our best to provide a memorable graduation experience for the Class of 2020 through a modified traditional ceremony with safety and equity as priorities.

Is ongoing monitoring in place?

- ✓ Encourage anyone who is sick to stay home
 - Plan for if students or employees get sick
- Regularly communicate and monitor developments with local authorities, employees, and families regarding cases, exposures, and updates to policies and procedures
- 1 Monitor student and employee absences and have flexible leave policies and practices
- Be ready to consult with the local 1 health authorities if there are cases in the facility or an increase in cases in the local area
